## Introduction

1. This report is submitted to the GEF Council for information in line with the Council decision in November 2010. It describes the overall activities of the GEF-NGO Network, with specific sections dedicated to the work carried out by its Central Focal Point, Regional Focal Points and Indigenous Peoples Focal Points.
2. The GEF-NGO Network is an independent Network of civil society organizations (CSOs) established in 1995 to facilitate civil society inputs to GEF processes. The GEF-NGO Network comprises more than 500 member organizations with experience and expertise in GEFs areas of work from all regions around the world. It is governed by a global Coordination Committee composed of representatives of elected Regional Focal Point organisations from 16 geographic regions and three Indigenous Peoples Focal Points from Asia, Africa and Latin America. The day-to-day work of the Network is coordinated by a Central Focal Point (CFP) elected from among the Coordination Committee members. It has been recognized by the GEF Council and GEF Secretariat as a key entity in the work of the GEF.
3. The following information document provides the progress made in the period July 2012-June 2013 by the GEF-NGO Network.

## Network Structure and Function

4. The basic Network structure was established in the late 1990s and consolidated through development and adoption of a series of guidelines and rules and procedures the most recent of which was adopted in December 2012 [<http://gefngo.org/index.cfm?&menuid=154&lang=EN>]. The Regional Focal Points (RFPs) are elected for four year terms from among the members in 16 different geographical regions (see **Annex 1**). The regional focal points are responsible for stimulating interest in GEF among CSOs in their regions and facilitating engagement of CSOs in GEF programmes and activities. Indigenous Peoples Focal Points (IPFPs) are selected through consultation among members of key Indigenous Peoples networks in three regions – Asia, Africa and Latin America. They also serve four year terms. The RFPs and IPFPs elect from among their number one organization to serve as the Central Focal Point (CFP) to act as secretariat and coordinate the day to day global coordination of the operations of the Network. The RFPs/IPFPs undertake the coordination of activities in their respective regions. The current list of RFPs, IPFPs and CFP is in **Annex 2**. In response to the GEF5 reforms the Network is in the process of enhancing its presence at the country level through the designation of country contact points – especially in countries with significant numbers of members as well as high GEF fund allocation. All these Network functions are undertaken primarily on a voluntary basis by the organizations and individuals involved.

5. The current Rules and Procedures of the Network set out the main procedures for Network functioning including membership, elections, representation, decision making and fund management. The network has its own complaints procedure to address any concerns from member organisations.
6. The Coordination Committee meets twice a year immediately before the GEF Council CSO consultation meetings prior to the Council. The committee oversees the work of the Network, approves budgets, strategies and workplans for the network operations. It also explores strategies to enhance the effectiveness of the Network's work to enhance civil society input to GEF. The Committee has established four sub-committees to address Governance, membership and elections; outreach and communication; Strategy and planning; and linkage with GEF-related conventions. Task forces are established from time to time to address key issues. In the past year, task forces and working groups have been established to oversee regional elections and to develop inputs to the GEF focal area strategies respectively.

## **Organisation and participation in GEF Related meetings**

### **GEF Council – CSO Consultations**

7. The GEF-NGO Network plays a key role in the organization of GEF Council – CSO Consultations immediately prior to the GEF Council meetings in Washington DC. These bring together representatives of member CSOs, GEF Council members, GEF Agencies, GEF related Conventions and GEF Secretariat. The meetings provide a forum for key issues of concern to civil society to be discussed with the GEF Council members, agency representatives and other stakeholders.
8. GEF Council-Civil Society consultations were organized by the Network prior to the 43rd GEF Council meeting in November 2012 and the 44<sup>th</sup> GEF Council in June 2013. Each meeting was attended by nearly 100 people from a broad range of stakeholders including council members, GEF Agencies, GEF Secretariat and CSOs. The GEF CEO participated in one hour dialogue sessions in each meeting providing an opportunity for CSOs to learn first-hand of key GEF initiatives and challenges.

The focus of the Network at the November 2012 consultation was on the key issues related to CSO engagement in GEF, financing needs for the environment and conventions implementation. Summary reports on the consultations are given at:

9. At the consultation prior to the 44<sup>th</sup> Council meeting, the key issues were related to work for the GEF6 and the vision and long term strategy for GEF 2020 Strategy. The meeting, especially on the future strategic role of GEF was very interactive with active inputs from Council members as well as CSOs. Summary reports on the consultations are given at:

## GEF Expanded Constituency Workshops

10. Between July 2012 to June 2013, the Network RFPs and members attended ECW meetings in Mozambique, Cote d'Ivoire, India, Turkey, Senegal, Cambodia, Chile, Tajikistan and Rwanda. During the workshops, the RFPs played an important role in facilitating knowledge sharing among CSOs as well as organizing special dialogue sessions. These CSO meetings deepened members' understanding of GEF work modalities and cooperation. . A list of meetings attended by Network focal points in the period is given in **Annex 3**.
11. Starting in March 2013, the RFPs helped to facilitate a special session on engagement of civil society in the work of GEF during the ECW meeting. In addition, a 1-day CSO meeting facilitated by the RFPs was also held in Cambodia, Chile, Tajikistan Rwanda and Congo, back-to-back with the ECW meetings.

## Input to GEF Policy Making

12. The Network presented a number of position papers, briefs and made associated statements in relation to GEF Council working papers at the respective GEF Council as listed below.

## **Input to GEF 6 Focal Area Strategies and Replenishment**

13. The Network has contributed to development of the GEF 6 Focal Area Strategies for the use of GEF6 resources. In this respect, Network has set up working groups on the GEF focal areas, namely

- Climate Change Mitigation
- Climate Change Adaptation
- Biodiversity
- International Waters
- Land Degradation

In addition, a representative from the Network joined the TAGs to prepare for the strategies for the Climate Change Mitigation, Chemicals and Cross Cutting Capacity Building Development. RFPs managed to collate input from selected regions that informed the strategies.

14. In relation to the strategies, the Network provided specific input into the two key documents of GEF 6, which were made available at the GEF 6 Replenishment meeting in April 2013. They are:

- GEF 6 Programming Directions
- Draft GEF Programming Strategy for Adaptation to Climate Change under the Least Developed Countries Fund (LDCF) and The Special Climate Change Fund (SCCF)

15. The GEF-NGO Network, represented by Faizal Parish, the Central Focal Point and Guenter Mitlacher, the RFP for Europe region attended the First Meeting of the GEF 6 Replenishment in Paris, France from the 3-4 March 2013. The meeting was interactive and reviewed the future long-term strategy for GEF and the programme directions as well as agreed on the replenishment process over the next 12 months. The Network presented 5 statements to the meeting as follows :

- Statement on the Occasion of the First meeting of the GEF 6 Replenishment process
- Statement on Draft GEF-6 Programming Directions (document GEF/R.6/07)
- Statement on GEF-6 Financing Issues (documents GEF/R.6/08, GEF/R.6/09)
- Statement on GEF Programming Strategy paper for Adaptation to Climate Change under the LDCF and SCCF
- Statement on the initial report of the Fifth Overall Performance Study (OPS5)

## **Outreach and communication**

16. The Network continued to maintain and develop the Network website [www.gefngo.org](http://www.gefngo.org) as an interactive communication tool between the Network and the members as well as others interested in CSO activities related to GEF. Electronic mailing groups were extensively used at regional and global level to disseminate information to members.

17. A communication officer was appointed on a part time basis in the CFP office to coordinate maintenance of the website, e-groups, develop e-newsletter and ensure regular communication with members. Many formal notifications, updates and reports were sent to all member organizations over the period. The use of the GEF-NGO Network website has significantly increased over this period, it has attracted a total of 109,000 visitors (up till Oct 2013). The number of visitors per month has steadily increased over the past year with the monthly average now topping 1700 visitors increased from 1000/month in 2011-2012.
18. To promote further outreach, during the reporting period, the Network developed and disseminated 3 issues of quarterly e-Newsletter (Sept 2012, Dec 2012 and March 2013). All the issues were available in Arabic version while the Dec 2012 also available in Spanish. In addition to the Network members, the newsletters were disseminated to the GEF Council Members, GEF Agencies, GEF Focal Points and others.
19. During the period July 2012 - June 2013, the GEF-NGO Network further enhanced efforts to engage civil society in the work of GEF. This mainly concentrated at global and seemingly regional level due to existing modalities such as Council meetings and ECWs. At the global and regional level this was facilitated through organization of a range of events and dialogues and operation of various outreach mechanisms..

### **Membership Development**

20. The membership of the Network is managed by the CFP and a Membership Officer was appointed on a part-time basis in the CFP office.
21. The membership of the Network has been growing steadily since the last reporting in June 2012. As of May 2013, there were 523 members in the Network compared to 471 members then, representing an increase of 52 members or more than 10%. Membership promotion was undertaken at global, regional and local levels through the RFP, international meetings, for example, during UNFCCC meeting, and through website. The current list of member organisations is given in **Annex 4**. In accordance to the Network's rules and regulation, membership renewal process was initiated in January 2013. This is to facilitate updating of membership status and profile.

### **Strengthening of links between GEF and CSOs in Convention meetings**

22. The CFP and the Europe RFP attended the COP11 CBD in Hyderabad, India from 14 – 18 Oct 2012. On October 15th, the GEF NGO Network and the GEF Secretariat organised a dialogue between the GEF CEO and CSOs attending the COP. The session was attended by nearly 100 CSOs from many countries. Focus of discussions included: The process for the development of the GEF 2020 Strategy and the options for CSO engagement in this process; challenges facing Indigenous communities in relation to addressing global

environment issues and involvement in GEF activities; the options and constraints for scaling up CSO experiences and best practices at the local level to national and regional levels.

23. After the dialogue, the Network hosted a side event on “Civil society engagement in GEF”. The side event discussed the options and constraints for civil society engagement in GEF and the CBD and highlighted the current mechanism to ensure civil society engagement in the implementation of GEF programmes and projects. The experience in CSO engagement through the Small Grant Programme and the results of the financing needs assessment for CBD implementation were also highlighted.
24. At UNFCCC COP 18 in Doha, the Network helped to promote a dialogue organised by the GEF Secretariat between civil society organisations and the GEF CEO on 4 Dec 2012. This event was attended by more than 100 CSOs and provided an opportunity for a lively debate and for the CEO to explain her vision for enhancing stakeholders involvement in the work of GEF.

## **Work of the Network Focal Points**

### **Regional Focal Points**

25. At the regional level, activities were undertaken by the RFPs in their respective region to enhance the role of civil society in GEF activities and in promoting the Network. Among the key activities undertaken by RFPs in their regions were :
  - a. Dissemination of information about events, meetings, updates and comment pertaining to environment and GEF activities to CSOs in their respective regions (including in respective regional languages).
  - b. Circulation of reports on achievements from GEF Council CSO consultations and the GEF Council
  - c. Soliciting and collating of inputs and comments from the constituency on Network position papers, GEF papers, etc.
  - d. Promote the Network through emails, website and meetings to encourage more local CSOs to be a part of the Network.
  - e. Sharing and dissemination of information on funding opportunities including SGP to CSOs.
  - f. Recommendation of participants from their region for participation in the GEF meetings, e.g. Council, Expanded Constituency Workshops (ECW) and other meetings.
  - g. Liaising with GEF operational Focal points in selected countries in their regions.
  - h. Participation in GEF Council Consultation meetings and GEF Council meetings and providing inputs to related position papers.
  - i. Participating in meetings of the Coordination Committee and relevant sub committees.
  - j. Participation in and coordination of CSO activities and presentation on CSO issues at ECW meetings, including organisation of CSO meetings at regional level back to back with ECW meetings (including meetings in Cambodia, Chile, Tajikistan, Rwanda and Congo).



## **Indigenous Peoples Focal Points**

26. During this period, the engagement between the Network with IP organizations and networks has been enhanced. There was also some engagement of IP organizations in country dialogues but the envisaged involvement of IP organisations in ECW was limited due to various constraints, related to the selection procedure and limitation of participation to one CSO representative per country.
27. The GEF Principles and Guidelines for Engagement of Indigenous Peoples was published by GEF Sec and disseminated with assistance of IPFPs and members of the IP Task Force. The two events organised at CBP COP11 and UNFCCC COP18 involved a significant number of IP representatives and a broad range of IP-related issues were discussed in the dialogues. Support was provided from the grant for a special session on GEF and the IP principles and guidelines at a Regional Indigenous Peoples' Workshop in Guatemala in December 2012.
28. The Network is represented in the Indigenous Peoples Advisory Group by Legborsi Saro Pyagbara, the Indigenous Peoples Focal Point for Africa.
29. The IPFPs were active in strengthening the engagement with IPs and the Networks. Their activities included:
  - a. Dissemination of information about events, meetings, updates and comments pertaining to environment and GEF activities to Indigenous peoples' organizations and Networks in their respective regions.
  - b. Circulation of reports on achievements from GEF Council CSO consultations and the GEF Council to Indigenous People's organizations and Networks
  - c. Sharing and dissemination of information on funding opportunities including SGP to Indigenous Peoples organisations.
  - d. Recommendation of participants from indigenous peoples' organizations for participation in the GEF meetings, e.g. Council, ECW and other meetings.
  - e. Participation in GEF Council-CSO Consultation meetings and GEF Council meetings and providing inputs to position papers on CSO engagement in GEF.
  - f. Participating in meetings of the Coordination Committee and relevant sub committees.
  - g. Participation in selected convention related meetings including CBD COP11 in Hyderabad and UNFCCC COP 18 in Doha.

## **Central Focal Point**

30. The Central Focal Point was actively involved in coordination of review of Council papers, preparation of Network position papers, organizing preparatory and Council-CSO meetings and other GEF-related meetings and overall administration of the Network. Among the key activities undertaken were :
  - a. Organising the Coordination Committee meeting, Preparatory meetings and GEF Council – CSO Consultation meetings during the 43<sup>rd</sup> and 44<sup>th</sup> Council meetings in November 2012 and June 2013 respectively.
  - b. Attending COP11 CBD in Hyderabad, India from 14 – 18 Oct 2012 and UNFCCC COP18 in Doha, Qatar 30 Nov - 6 Dec 2012 and organization/co-organisation of related Side events with CSOs.

- c. Attended the Asia-Pacific Regional Dialogue on Climate Finance and the Green Climate Fund (GCF) on 7-8 March, 2013 organised by ADB. During the dialogue, a presentation was given sharing the 20 years of experience of the GEF in civil society engagement as model for the GCF.
- d. Working with the GEF Sec to develop a program and presentation/discussion module for the 2013 ECW meetings and secured funding from GEF Sec for a CSO meeting to be held back to back with each ECW meeting in 2013, starting April 2013. To guide the RFPs in running the meeting, the CFP developed a guideline which outlined step-by-step on how to conduct the sessions.
- e. Participated in the GEF6 TAG to prepare for the strategies for Cross Cutting Capacity Building Development and attended the TAG meeting on 6 Feb 2013 in Washington DC.
- f. Represented the GEF-NGO Network to the First Meeting of the GEF 6 Replenishment in Paris, France from the 3-4 April 2013 where the Network presented 5 statements to the meeting.
- g. Outreach and communication with members to share information on GEF-NGO Network and GEF activities including e-group and website operation and maintenance.
- h. Coordinating membership administration and promotion.
- i. Coordinating preparation of Network policy and position papers for GEF Council sessions, including the GEF 6 Strategies for the use of GEF6 resources and 5 working groups on the GEF focal areas.
- j. Securing and managing funds and resources for the Network, including securing a grant from the Voluntary Fund to review the implementation of the Public Involvement Policy and the PIF for a MSP on strengthening capacity and opportunities for active CSO engagement in synergistic implementation of global environmental conventions.
- k. Coordinating the review of the implementation of the Public Involvement Policy, including getting feedbacks from the various stakeholders during the ECWs and developing contracts for consultants to undertake some studies.

## **Finance and Administration**

31. Although the Network primarily works on a voluntary basis – it needs resources to cover the cost of specific activities and services including administration and governance, outreach, advocacy engagement, and participation at GEF related meetings and workshops,.
32. A grant of \$50,000 was received from the GEFSEC for May 2011 – May 2012, June 2012 – May 2013 and subsequently for June 2013 – May 2014. In line with its procedures for financial management, Network accounts are audited on a calendar year basis and the audit reports posted on the Network website.
33. In addition, the Network has secured a grant of \$86,350 from the Voluntary Fund to review the implementation of the Public Involvement Policy. Under this grant which runs April 2013 – June 2014, the Network will provide input and recommendations to the GEF Sec for the formulation of guidelines for

agencies and government on public participation in GEF project development and implementation.

34. During the year, the GEF Secretariat supported the participation of 64 places for CSOs in the November 2012 and the June 2013 Council/CSO Consultation meetings. This support consisted of travel, accommodation and meal expenses during the Preparatory, Consultations and Council meetings. Funding was also provided to support participation of members of the network as well as RFPs in the GEF ECW meetings. Co-financing was also provided by Network members for a number of activities through significant time input as well as costs for a number of participants in various meetings.
35. The Network continued to work on drafting a PIF for a MSP on strengthening capacity and opportunities for active CSO engagement in synergistic implementation of global environmental conventions. The purpose of the proposed PIF is to serve as the long-term funding support for the Network.

### **Key issues/concerns and recommendations**

#### **Progress in addressing issues raised in the 2011-2012 Report**

36. Six issues requiring action by the Council or secretariat were highlighted in the Network's Report to Council for 2011-2012 as follows:
  - a) Enhancing the procedures for the selection and travel arrangements for CSOs supported to attend GEF Council-CSO consultations
  - b) Enhancing the role of the Network in selecting participants for the ECW meetings
  - c) Contributions to the GEF NGO Voluntary Fund
  - d) Adjustment of Selection procedure for CSO Participants in the GEF Assembly
  - e) Review and update the GEF Public Involvement Policy
  - f) Establishment of the Mechanisms to enhance engagement of Indigenous peoples and GEF
37. Progress has been generally positive during the year with good achievements in a number of areas, as follows:

#### **Full or partial progress**

- a) Enhancing the procedures for the selection and travel arrangements for CSOs supported to attend GEF Council-CSO consultations  
Some improvements have been made starting with the June 2012 Council on selection and travel arrangements – however there still remains a problem for participants from a number of countries to obtain visas on time and in travel arrangements. The GEFSEC has also shown flexibility on allowing additional participants when budgets permit.
- b) Enhancing the role of the Network in selecting participants for the ECW meetings.

Improvements have been made in 2012-2013 in the coordination between the GEF Secretariat and the Network in identification and selection of participants to attend the ECW meetings. This has enabled better preparations to have been made by the Network prior to the meetings and has enabled back to back meetings of CSOs to be organized at several ECWs. Since April 2013 CSOs have played an active role in the ECWs with special sessions organized to discuss CSO engagement in the work of the GEF.

c) Contributions to the GEF NGO Voluntary Fund

The GEF NGO Voluntary Fund was established in January 2012. Initial funds comprised the remaining funds from earlier donor grants in the 1990s as well as additional funds from the GEF secretariat. Funds have been used in 2012-2013 to support a review of the GEF Public Involvement Policy. Several proposals have been made for use of the fund and additional contributions are required – especially from donor countries. No progress has been made in 2012-2013 in securing additional contributions to the fund.

**Recommendation :** The GEF Secretariat and the GEF NGO Network should work together to encourage contributions from donors to the Voluntary Fund

d) Adjustment of Selection procedure for CSO Participants in the GEF Assembly

It was agreed in June 2013 that the participants for the GEF Assembly would be selected jointly between the Network and the GEF Secretariat.

e) Review and update the GEF Public Involvement Policy

Agreement was reached in principle in December 2012 between the Network and the GEF Secretariat to initiate a review of the GEF public involvement policy. Details were finalized in April 2013 and work to collect feedback via special sessions at ECW meetings was initiated. It is envisaged that a report and recommendations by the network will be made in late 2013 to enable adjustments as necessary to the GEF PIP to be made in 2014.

**Recommendation :** The GEF Council to note the progress made and the potential need to update the GEF Public Involvement Policy in 2014.

f) Establishment of the Mechanisms to enhance engagement of Indigenous peoples and GEF

A paper on GEF Principles and Guidelines on the engagement with IPs was finalized by the GEF Secretariat in June 2012 following extensive input and consultation with Indigenous peoples facilitated by the Network and an Indigenous peoples Task Force. This paper identified a number of key proposed mechanisms to strengthen engagement of indigenous peoples including:

- (a) Designation of an Indigenous Peoples focal point for effective and timely engagement with Indigenous Peoples.
- (b) Creation of an Indigenous Peoples Advisory Group.

- (c) Reviewing and enhancing GEF monitoring systems to track the effectiveness of the implementation of GEF Policies, Procedures, and Guidelines related to Indigenous Peoples, and the level of engagement of Indigenous Peoples in GEF projects and processes.
- (d) Knowledge and capacity development for Indigenous Peoples to support their active and effective participation in GEF planning, project cycle and other relevant processes.
- (e) Capacity building among the GEF Secretariat staff, as well as knowledge development and transfer mechanisms.
- (f) Identification and strengthening of financial arrangements to support Indigenous Peoples

In the past 12 months there has been some progress on the above. Interim membership of the IP Advisory Group has been agreed and the first meeting was scheduled to be held in July 2013. Information on the level of Engagement of Indigenous peoples was included in the GEF Annual performance review for 2012-13..

**Recommendation:** Further work is required to fully put in place the mechanisms to support the implementation of the Guidelines on Indigenous peoples including the allocation of adequate financial resources to enable their effective implementation.

#### 38. Other issues

The Network has identified three additional issues

- a) Enhancing support for CSO engagement with the GEF at COPs of various multilateral environmental agreements (MEAs)
- b) Building strong mechanisms for Network member engagement at national, regional and global such as through incorporation of CSO reps in GEF monitoring and evaluation teams;
- c) Explore ways of convening regular GEF National Dialogues to strengthen the relationship between GEF, agencies, implementing partners and civil society
